

Every licensed child care program in the City of Toronto has an assigned Special Needs Resource person. These specialized professionals provide the consistent support needed so that *every child* can take part in the child care program of his or her family's choice.

These supports include:

- ✿ Regular visits to programs
- ✿ Early identification and intervention
- ✿ Individual consultation
- ✿ Program consultation
- ✿ Staff and provider training
- ✿ Program adaptations and environmental assessments
- ✿ Service coordination and referral
- ✿ Enhanced staffing/intensive resource support, when needed.
